Times running out for sowing seeds. However, foxglove seeds sown now will flower next year while on the food front you can still sow carrots, radish, French beans and salad leaves of all sorts in July to eat this year. For ornamentals July is the last month for sowing Delphiniums to flower next year. For-get-me-nots for next spring can be sown now – they grow very well in Baginton but if you don't want your whole garden awash with them be sure to pull them out before they seed next year. In early July pansies can be sown for planting out in the autumn and flowering next year
