## **Baginton Gardeners**

Once again, Darren Rudge presented an extremely informative talk on 'Pruning – Improving What You Have Got' to our meeting in March. His message was clear, we are in control when we lift the secateurs or loppers!

There are 3 rules to help us in pruning our garden plants:

- 1. You are telling the plant how you want it to grow; so have a vision and plan in mind! Do a few cuts, step back, look at the plant, do more if needed; know when to stop!
- 2. Why are you pruning? To maintain or improve the size, shape and health of the plant. Good pruning lets in light, water and air, all necessary for heathy growth,
- 3. Understand a little of how plants grow and where and how to cut. Cut 5mm above a bud, ensure cut is sloped away from the bud to let water run off. Pinch out apex bud to encourage bushier plants.

The 5 basic principles of pruning are D.D.D.X.U. Look for the following when pruning: -

D – Dead Wood D - Disease D – Damage X – Crossing branches U – Untypical Growth, look for mutations.

So, when should we prune? The general rule is Deciduous plants – November to March, Evergreens – September/October <u>and</u> March. Remember there are times when you will need a specialist, particularly with large trees!

His final message was Know what you want, be inspired by nature and HAVE FUN WITH PRUNING!

## **Baginton Parish Council**

Dear Residents,

It has generally been another quiet month from the Parish Council viewpoint, but there have been a few developments that may affect Baginton.

### Investment Zone and Gigafactory Announcements

There were a few announcements earlier in March that could have a direct impact on Baginton.

Coventry City Council have been promoting the airport as a battery gigafactory site since 2020, spending millions of pounds to secure an operator. Despite their efforts, there are currently no firm offers. Tata Group as the owners of JLR was interested, but eventually chose to invest £4 billion in a gigafactory site in Somerset.

A further investment of £35million was announced for '*highways and infrastructure works to accelerate the development of the site and prepare it for occupation by a battery operator.*' The monies have been offered as part of the West Midlands Investment Zone, which was announced by Jeremy Hunt in his Autumn budget. It is not clear what highways and infrastructure works are planned, but Baginton village is likely to be affected to some degree.

Andy Street, the Mayor of the West Midlands, said that the Government's £35 million was not enough 'to get the gigafactory across the line', suggesting that he is working towards securing further investment from the private sector.

At the same time, Warwickshire County Council announced that a Level 2 Devolution Agreement had been granted to them from the Government. Whilst separate from the West Midlands Investment Zone announcement, the Level 2 Agreement does give Warwickshire County Council more input and control over local developments, rather than it being directed remotely from Government in London.

The Parish Council will keep an eye on developments and keep residents informed.

### **Annual Assembly**

This year, the Annual Parish Assembly will be held on 11<sup>th</sup> April from 7:30pm in the Village Hall main room. Everybody is welcome. Short reports will be received from Charities and organisations that work within our village and questions will be taken from the public. Police, County Councillors and District Councillors have all been invited to attend, to answer any questions you may have.

### **Parish Council Accounts**

This is my 11<sup>th</sup> year preparing the Parish Council Accounts, so I think I am finally getting the hang of it. As always, the draft accounts will be mounted on our village website after they have been prepared in April. We then go through a series of Internal and External Audits before the accounts are hopefully signed-off by the Government appointed Auditors in September. It has been an uneventful year from a Financial viewpoint, so I am not expecting anything different to previous years, but I will keep you updated.
