Refuse and Recycling Collections Over Christmas and the New Year

During the Christmas and New Year period, the day for your recycling and refuse collections will change. This will mean that: -

Your Blue recycling bin and Food caddy will be emptied on Monday 22nd December as normal.

Your Food caddy will be emptied on Tuesday 30th December 2025 Your Food caddy, Grey refuse and Blue recycling bins will be emptied on Tuesday 6th January 2026.

Please ensure that your bins are presented at the edge of your property by 6am on your amended collection day.

Green bin collections suspension

Green bin collections will be suspended over the Christmas and New Year period, to allow crews to prioritise the additional recycling and food waste that accrues.

The last Green bin collection for 2025 will be on Monday 22nd December and the first for 2026 will be Monday 19th January

Recycling wrapping paper and Christmas cards

Recycle wrapping paper and Christmas cards with your cardboard in your blue bin. You cannot recycle foil wrapping paper, glittery wrapping paper, glittery cards, ribbons, bows and tape.

What to do with extra recycling over Christmas?

Put extra recycling in a sturdy container or red box and place beside your blue bin. Please flatten or cut large cardboard into pieces no larger than 1m x 1m.

We are not able to collect any side waste from your grey bin or food caddy. Please ensure that all waste is inside your bin.

Christmas tree recycling

Green bin collections resume in Baginton from Monday 19th January 2026 when real Christmas trees will be collected, and you don't need to have a green bin permit subscription to have yours picked up. Please ensure that all lights, decorations, tree stands, pots and netting are removed. Any tree that is over 5ft tall must be cut in half.

Leave your tree outside in a place that's not obstructing the highway, and they'll collect it for you.

If you're subscribed to the green bin service, you can chop it up and put it in your bin.

Alternatively, you could arrange a collection to support charity. This year JustHelping are supporting The Myton Hospice and Pass The Smile by offering a real Christmas tree collection and recycling service from your doorstep for a small donation. Collections take place 9th – 11th January 2026. For more information or to book your collection simply visit www.just-helping.org.uk/register-tree and register your tree before registration closes at midnight on Monday 5th January 2026.

Were You There? Life in Baginton – Memories of School

A few more quotes from Baginton School.

"Like all the boys we used to try to pee up and over the wall in the boys toilets - I never managed it."

"The Christmas play. I was going to be the Angel Gabriel. I was so looking forward to wearing a white silky long robe but I got chicken pox! I had to man the record player instead. This was quite a prestigious job but not the same as wearing something long and floaty. All the female characters in the nativity play had bright blue eyeshadow. A few days later we had the Christmas party. With games - I didn't enjoy those. We had sandwiches made with mashed bananas and jam. We loved them! Father Christmas gave us all a present. These were really good. One year I had a little battery operated lantern; I thought it was lovely. These were funded by the school jumble sale/raffle and sale of delicious fudge, made by the infants class teacher and a baby doll beautifully dressed in knitted clothes".

"We played football in the playground behind the school and the ball frequently went up onto the roof. It was quite competitive to see who was the quickest to climb up onto the roof to get the ball back. I was definitely the best".

"Sports day used to be held on the grass running from the church and behind the school buildings.

We had the usual egg and spoon races but also 'Scott and Raleigh' and 'deportment'- running (or walking) with a book balanced on your head!"

"There was an air raid shelter at the side of the girls toilets."

"I remember playing a game called Captain ball, it involved a football sized ball been thrown, you had to hit the ball and run to the other side of the playground before being hit by the ball that was thrown at you."

"There was a hopscotch roughly where David's House is now and we used to do Maypole dancing and country dancing."

Many thanks for these snippets from Louise, Della, Alan and Rowena. I have a few more people to visit still and hope to post their memories on the village Facebook page in the New Year. It's lovely to hear from you, please do get in touch if these have jogged your memory and you would like to add to the picture of life at Baginton School.


