Top Tips for May

- Prune spring shrubs after flowering to keep them compact.
- Plant out dahlia tubers and other tender plants after all risk of frost has passed.
- Tie in new shoots of climbing plants to their supports.
- Check plants for pests, especially lilies and fritillaries for scarlet lily beetles.
- Harden off tender plants raised indoors, but bring them back in at night to protect from late frosts.
- Pinch out shoot tips and thin out seedlings, to encourage bushier growth and strong-growing plants.
- Earth up potatoes, covering the shoots with soil as they appear.
- Sow sweetcorn in deep pots, so the young plants are ready to transplant into the garden in June.
- Reduce snail populations by going on regular evening hunts, especially during damp weather.
- Sowing runner, dwarf and climbing French beans, directly outdoors in warm weather.
- Open fruit cage doors or lift netting to ensure pollinating insects can get access to the flowers.
- Remove all strawberry runners, so plants put their full energy into fruiting.
- Use fleece to protect young seedlings or fruit blossom, if late frosts are forecast.
- Put up Greenhouse shading to lower daytime temperatures and reduce scorching of young plants.
- Open Greenhouse doors and vents on warm days, but close in the evening on cold nights.
- Transplant tomatoes into growing bags or large pots tying main stems to a cane for support.
